‘See Your Face Again’

OUT ON FRIDAY 16TH JUNE

‘See Your Face Again’ is the Marsh Family’s inspiring new single. It is written especially for Refugee Week (19-25th June) whose 2023 theme is **#compassion**. The video raises awareness of the work of Kent Refugee Action Network in helping young refugees and asylum seekers to succeed.

This new release is the Kent family’s first ever musical collaboration, connecting their own viral story with that of Afghan musician Ali Esmahilzada (27) who fled Kabul in 2022. In April 2023, millions discovered the news report of Ali being gifted an antique violin in the US, allowing him to resume playing. Ali’s new violin, recorded for the first time and mixed remotely from Los Angeles, resonates to add poignancy to the song’s cry for connection and empathy.

The song is driven by soft vocals, achingly wishful lyrics, and flickering instrumentation. Through guitar, cello and clarinet, it moves its listeners to a sense of harmony, urging them to treat refugees as people in need of support.

The versatile *Marsh Family* consists of parents Ben (46) and Danielle Marsh (45) and their children Alfie (16), Thomas (15), Ella (13) and Tess (11). They brought a breath of fresh air to lockdowns by sharing their parody songs with a unique mix of humour, heart, and hope – dubbed the ‘Von Trapped’ family by the [New York Times](#). Now with a worldwide following, the relatable family are returning to the global issue of migration. Having shared hilarious ‘Braverman Shanties’ in late 2022 that earned over 3 million views, ‘See Your Face Again’ offers a warmer tone. Its video is filmed at iconic heritage sites around Kent, a county on the frontline of migration issues, and with a long history as an international gateway.
